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UP PCS(J) EXAM

STAGE-1: PRELIMS

Preliminary examination is the first and very important stage of the three stages of the Judicial Services Examination.

STRUCTURE:


The Preliminary stage consists of two papers:

- Paper I General Studies
- Paper II Law
- ➤ Paper I General Studies consists of 150 questions of 1 mark each which is to be answered in 2 hours.
- Paper II Law consists of 150 questions of 2 marks each which is to be answered in 2 hours.

Negative Marking:-

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For each question, for which a wrong answer is given, one-third of the marks assigned to that question are deducted as penalty. If a candidate gives more than one answer it is treated as wrong answer. If a question is left blank, there is no penalty for that question.



SYLLABUS:

Strategy for Prelims Exam

- Most of the candidates think of working hard only, but it is combination of hard plus smart
 work in a planned manner that would pay in this examination. Smart work means a student
 should know what areas are important from prelims exam point of view and what not.
- One can clear the Judicial Services Prelims in one shot. Understanding concepts should be
 the first priority because mugging up neither help in Prelims nor in Mains. So focus on basic
 understanding of concepts.
- Read bare provisions and illustrations along with class notes regularly because with each revision, your command on the provisions and contents will improve and you will understand law in a better way.
- Note down leading case laws and recent case laws in a notebook in bullet points and revise them regularly so that you can answer almost each and every question related to case laws in prelims exam.
- Read newspapers and current affairs magazine regularly on daily basis.
- Go through previous year questions asked in judicial service exams in various states as well other competitive exams related to law and GS. Solve at least 50 questions daily, it will help you a lot on your final day.
- Xerox content pages of all the bare acts related to the syllabus of the exam and annex in a
 file. Revise contents pages or headings of important sections on a regular basis, so that you
 can easily attempt all questions related to contents pages in the exam without any confusion
 and score good marks.

STAGE-2: MAIN EXAM

This is the second and most important phase of the Judicial Service Examination in which the candidates are admitted after passing the Preliminary examination.

Candidates equal to ten times the number of vacancies are qualified for the Main Exam.

The second stage of the Judicial Services Exam is a subjective type of examination consisting of six papers.

The subjects covered in main examination consist of one GS paper, one paper on English Language, one paper of Hindi Language and three papers on Law.

In the main examination a descriptive answer is expected in an organized manner.

The candidates will be evaluated not only for their writing and analytical ability but also for the understanding of the various issues that hold importance from examination point of view, also playing an important role in the Judicial system.

The nature of the questions of GK paper will be such that one can evaluate the general awareness of the candidates on various issues and subjects.

English language paper will be of 100 marks. It shall comprise three questions as specified below:-

- (i) Essay 50 marks
- (ii) Précis writing 30 marks
- (iii) Translation of passage from Hindi to English 20 marks

Hindi language paper will be of 100 marks. It shall comprise three questions as specified below:-

(i) Essay: 50 marks

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(ii) Precis writing: 30 marks

(iii) Translation of passage form English to Hindi: 20 marks

Substantive law paper will be of 200 marks. The question set will be restricted to the field covered by:- The law of contracts, the law of Partnership, the law concerning easements and torts, the Law relating to transfer of property including the principles of equity, specifically applicable thereto, the principal of Equity with special reference to the Law of trust and specific relief, Hindu Law and Mohammedan Law, and Constitutional Law. There shall be questions of 50marks in relation to Constitutional Law alone.

Procedure and Evidence paper will be of 200 marks. Questions set will be restricted to the field covered by-the law of evidence, the

Criminal Procedure Code and Code of Civil Procedure, including the principles of pleading. The question set will relate mainly to practical matters such as the framing of charges and issues the methods of dealing with the evidence of witnesses the writing of judgment and the conduct of cases generally but will not be restricted to them.

Penal, revenue and local laws paper will be of 200 marks. Questions set will be restricted to the field covered by-Indian Penal Code, Uttar Pradesh Revenue Code, 2006, Uttar Pradesh Urban Building (Regulation of Letting, Rent and Eviction) Act, 1972, the Uttar Pradesh Regulation of Urban Premises Tenancy Act, 2021, Uttar Pradesh Municipalities Act, U.P. Panchayat Raj Act, U.P. Consolidation of Holdings Act, Uttar Pradesh Urban (Planning and

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Development) Act 1973, together with rules framed under the aforesaid Acts. Answer to the questions of Local Laws will be compulsory. Questions pertaining to Penal Laws will be of 50 marks, whereas, that of Revenue and Local Laws will be of 150 marks.

Clarification: The candidates will have a choice to answer General Knowledge and Law papers either in Hindi or in English.

Strategy for Main Exam:

- Know the syllabus thoroughly and prepare a time-table for studying all the topics according to the syllabus regularly.
- Revise topic-wise class notes and selfprepared notes regularly.
- Prepare good key notes during self study. If you want to make the concept more clear, then, while preparing notes of lectures, leave some space and just after the lecture fill up the space with clarifications.
- Do not study from too many sources. Select one book for basic concepts, bare acts and previous years questions books for main exam preparation.
- Read newspapers and current affairs magazine regularly on daily basis.
- Practice essay writing, précis writing and translation passages from Hindi to English and vice-versa.
- Go through previous year papers of various judicial services main exam and other

competitive exams relating to law and general studies. Practice answer writing from the beginning for the mains exam. Prepare a notebook and write at least two answers daily within a stipulated time, it will improve your answer writing skill and time management.

Stage-III

Judicial Services Viva-Voce/ Personal Interview

It is the last stage of the selection process. In the interview, the candidates are evaluated based on their knowledge of Law, General Knowledge, personality, and other factors.

Candidates equal to three times the number of vacancies are called for interview.

The candidate will be interviewed by a Board which will have before it, the record of his career. He/she will be asked questions on matters of general interest and related to law, social and legal issues .The object of the interview is to assess the personal suitability of the candidate for a career in judicial service by a Board of competent and unbiased observers. The test is intended to judge the mental calibre of a candidate. In broad terms, this is really an assessment of not only his intellectual qualities but also social traits and his interest in current affairs. Some of the qualities, to be judged are mental alertness, critical powers assimilation, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgment, variety and depth of interest, ability for social cohesion and leadership, intellectual and moral integrity.

The technique of the interview is not that of a strict crossexamination but of a natural, though directed and purposive conversation which is intended to reveal the mental qualities of the candidate.

The interview test is not intended to be a test either of the specialized or general knowledge of the candidates which have been already tested through their written papers. Candidates are expected to have taken an intelligent interest not only in their special subjects of academic study but also in the events which are happening around them both within and outside their own state or country as well as in modern currents of thought and in new discoveries which should rouse the curiosity of well educated youth.



Interview has a great scoring potential. Though the process is just of 15 to 25 minutes but marks scored have a wide range: 60 to 80. It is the last chance to maximize final score. Even if score in the Written Examinations is near the cut-off, one can score very high and be in the selection list.

Clarification- The marks scored in the main examination & interview are considered while preparing the final merit list.
